#### and a word from the SRU...

Pollowing the new partnership with BT two years ago we were able to implement plans to strengthen our support of clubs. These take the form of several interventions with the creation of regional Club Services Manager (CSM's) roles having arguably the biggest impact.

Previously, Scottish Rugby supported clubs predominantly in the areas of 'on-field' e.g. coaching, refereeing, development etc with only minor support for 'off-field' areas.

The CSM's all have business development experience and assist clubs with the 'off-field' areas such as creating and implementing their strategic / business plans and key areas such as facility development and income generation.

We developed a business planning diagnostic to help clubs assess their strengths and weaknesses and formulate this into a business plan. To date over 90 clubs have benefited from the club diagnostic process and have plans in place.

Another major initiative has been the creation of a Club Sustainability Fund with £1.6m of finance available over four years to clubs to help them with capital and revenue projects. To date 91 clubs have benefitted from awards for improving their facilities and employing business development posts. The capital strand of the fund works in tandem with the sportscotland lottery fund where clubs can apply for lottery funding through the one application process. Over £1.5m of funds for club projects have been secured from the lottery over the first two years of the fund.

We have used case studies and best practice to great effect as messages from the many successful club projects to attract more to their clubs, raise their profile and increase income, are very powerful. We highlight these with over 50 resources on our website and run workshops every year and a large Club Development Conference every two years.

The environment for clubs is challenging just now with many options for how people spend their leisure time, increasing travel and utility costs and sponsorship being harder to come by. The support of Friends of Scottish Rugby to Scottish Rugby clubs is very appreciated and is often the final part of a funding package that makes projects viable.
